*“Wherefore when He comes into the world, He says, ‘Sacrifice and offering you will not have, but a body you have prepared me. (6) In burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin you have had no pleasure.’ (7) Then said I, ‘Lo, I come (in the volume of the book it is written of me) to do your will, O God.’ (8) Above when He said, ‘Sacrifice and offering and burnt offerings and offering for sin you did not will, neither had you pleasure therein’ -- which are offered by the law. (9) Then He said, ‘Lo, I come to do your will, O God.’ He takes away the first, that He may establish the second.*  
He.10:5-9

This text tells us of the coming into this world of the eternal Son of God. It also discloses to us the purpose and intention of the Almighty in His doing so. All of the Old Covenant is exposed here as being but a type and shadow of what we now realize as being the eternally established New Covenant. The eternal Son, being equal with God, the Father and God, the Holy Spirit, knew exactly what the Great Triumvirate intended for Him and, along with them, willed exactly what was supposed to happen.

The sacrifices and offerings that were mandated under the Old Covenant were, ultimately, not supposed to be adequate in atoning for the sins of all the saved ones.

What was needed was a willing and perfectly holy substitute. A substitute in whom it was impossible to sin. A substitute that was motivated by a divine and everlasting love to be and do exactly what was necessary in order to perform an eternally effective atonement. And, this is exactly where the eternal Son of God (not the law) comes into play. This is exactly what the Lord Jesus Christ personally fulfilled.

When the Old Covenant was instituted, it was immediately obvious that another covenant would become necessary in order to eternally secure it's constituents. This, again, is where the Lord Jesus comes into play. For He, as the eternal Son, is the one that the total sum of the volume of the book specifically refers to. He is the one that comes onto the stage of the history of human fallen-ness and performs exactly what the will of God -- from the Word of God -- demands.

Therefore does Jn.1:14 plainly assert: *“And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.”*

And finally, Jesus, Himself, identifies precisely what the will of God is when He declares from Jn.6:38-40> *“For I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of Him who sent me. (39) This is the will of the Father who sent me, that of all He has given me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up at the last day. (40) And this is the will of Him who sent me, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have everlasting life, and I will raise him up at the last day.”*
